MINUTES OF THE ORDINARY BOARD MEETING HELD ON 18.12.2018 AT 1100 HOURS IN THE OFFICE OF THE CANTONMENT BOARD, GOLIBAR MAIDAN, PUNE.

At the outset, Major General Navneet Kumar & Brig. S N Sudumbrekar, VSM, SEMO took the oath as President Cantonment Board & Ex-Officio Member respectively of the Board.

On behalf of the Board CEO and Vice President welcomed the President Cantonment Board.

Further the President addressed the Board and thanked that he has become the President of one of the oldest Cantonment. Further he stated that inspite of financial constraints, we have to become a dynamic Board.

01. WRIT PETITION TO BE FILED IN THE HON'BLE MUMBAI HIGH COURT/SUPREME COURT OF INDIA REGARDING ALLOTMENT OF SHARE OF THE REVENUE DERIVED BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT FROM COLLECTION OF GST WITHIN THE LIMITS OF PUNE CANTONMENT.

Reference CBR No.95 dated 17.01.2018.

To consider the legal opinion dated 11.12.2018 received from M/s Mulla and Mulla, Advocates and Solicitors of the Board in connection with filing of legal proceedings in the High Court of Mumbai/Supreme Court of India regarding compensation of LBT/allotment of shares of revenue derived by the State Government/Central Government from collection of GST within the limits of Pune Cantonment area. Pune Cantonment Board has sought legal opinion vide letter dated 13.11.2018 as to whether Pune Cantonment Board can file a suitable Writ Petition against the State Government/Union Government for claiming their compensation of LBT/allotment of share of the revenue derived by the State Government from collection of the GST within the limits of Pune Cantonment.

M/s Mulla and Mulla in their aforesaid legal opinion has advised that Cantonment Board should file appropriate legal proceedings/Writ Petition under Article 226 of the constitution of India directing the State Government to amend the schedule of the Maharashtra (GST Compensation Act)2016 to include the Pune Cantonment Board in the schedule of the said Act and alternatively direction to the State Government to consider the Pune Cantonment written representation regarding allocation of share of GST collected within the Pune Cantonment area and to deliver decision therein. The case is also referred to the legal firm of the Board at Delhi namely Legal integra who are on the panel of the Board for obtaining their legal opinion vide this Office letter dated 4th December,2018 and the same is awaited.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note:

- i. **Abolition of octroi** Pune Municipal corporation were collecting octroi prior to 2013 and Pune Cantonment Board was getting a share of octroi from Pune Municipal Corporation to the tune of Rs.30.00 Crores per annum. The Government of Maharashtra has abolished Octroi with effect from 01.04.2013 and hence the Octroi share which the Board was getting from Pune Municipal Corporation has been discontinued. The adjoining Municipal corporations have therefore imposed Local Body Tax in the Corporation limits. Due to the discontinuation of the receipt of the octroi share and further discontinuation of the Local Body Tax, the Board is facing severe financial constraints as it was a major source of revenue.
- ii. **Imposition of LBT** In order to withstand the depletion of revenue due to octroi abolition, the Board had implemented LBT in the Cantonment area as well after Gazette Notification. The Central Government in view of the provisions contained in section 71 of the Cantonment Act,2006 authorized the Board to impose Local Body Tax within its jurisdiction vide SRO No.22 dated 04.06.2015. Subsequently, as per the amendment under the Maharashtra Municipal Act in the LBT Rules,2010, the Board vigorously perused

to suitably amend the LBT Rules of the Board to keep the same in parity with the provisions applicable in the adjoining Municipal corporation. The proposal to this effect was forwarded to the Higher Authorities for necessary amendment in the Bye-laws with Gazette notification which was thereafter obtained.

The Board on imposition of LBT was able to derive a revenue to the tune of Rs.100.00 Crores per annum, which yielded a very positive effect and the Board was able to undertake many public development works which had stagnated due to shortage of funds. The implementation of LBT in short had given an impetus for development of cantonment area. The LBT was subsequently abolished with effect from 01.08.2015.

It was anticipated that on account of the decision of the State Government to abolish the LBT, the Board would get relief in case the State Government incorporates the Pune Cantonment Board in compensation schemes. However, the Government of Maharashtra is compensating the loss incurred by the Corporation/Municipalities only and the Board is deprived of the same.

iii. Allocation of share of GST to Pune Cantonment Board - The Local Body Tax has been subsumed in the Goods & Service Tax. Subsequent to the introduction of GST, the Board has forwarded various letters to the concerned Authorities of the State Government with a request to allot share of GST being collected by the State Government from the area of Pune Cantonment but there has been no response. The Board in their meeting held on 17.01.2018 has viewed with concern the non-receipt of any share from the State Government and accordingly the matter was also taken up with the relevant Authorities but there has been no response. Also the Board in their meeting held on 26.05.2018 held detailed discussions and deliberations in the subject matter and have resolved to file a Writ Petition before the Hon'ble High Court, Mumbai as the Board had no other option.

In this connection, the Board had also taken up the matter with the Special Secretary, GST Council, New Delhi for allotment of share of revenue derived by the State Government from collection of revenue in the Cantonment area. However, the Board has been informed that the subject issue falls under the Union List of Seventh Schedule of the Constitution and accordingly it falls under the purview of the Ministry of Defence. It has been further informed that it is a policy issue impinging upon finances of many Cantonment Board and that the issue should be examined in consultation with the M o D.

RESOLUTION NO. 1: Considered. CEO explained the background of the case and also expressed that the discussion on GST has been several times reflected in the Board meetings. The President

Cantonment Board expressed that taking into account the financial position of the Board he himself has communicated the factual position to the Higher Authorities viz. GOC-in-C, SC, Pune. The Board noted the same.

Further CBLA read out the opinion given by M/s Mulla and Mulla dated 14.12.2018 wherein it has been opined that Pune Cantonment Board should approach the Hon'ble High Court of Bombay under Article 226 of the Constitution of India by way of filing Writ Petition to amend the schedule of the Maharashtra GST compensation Act to include Pune Cantonment Board therein for compensation LBT/allotment of share of revenue derived by Government/Central Government from collection of GST within the limits of Pune Cantonment area and Cantonment Board should press for alternative remedy to consider their representation.

Further CEO pointed out that opinion is also sought from Legal Integra, a Delhi based Panel Firm of the Board and the opinion is awaited. Simultaneously letters has been forwarded to PD DE, SC & DG DE, New Delhi for seeking advice / opinion for filing the Writ Petition in the appropriate Court. The advice / opinion is still awaited.

Further Smt. Priyanka R Shrigiri, Vice President stated that since the legal opinion from Legal Integra is awaited, views from PD DE & DGDE may also be sought for regarding filing of Writ Petition and thereafter the decision be taken.

Further Smt. Kiran T Mantri, Elected Member suggested that if all the Cantonment of Maharashtra State will jointly file a Writ for allotting the share of GST, the case can be stronger. CEO opined that it is a good suggestion but financially the GST collection by the State Government from Pune is much on the higher side in comparison to the remaining Cantonment. The Board noted the same.

Further Shri Atul Gaikwad and Smt Kiran Mantri – Elected Members pointed out that since the MPs/MLAs are the Special Invitess of the Board a special meeting should be held with them regarding this issue so that they can apprise the Parliament the correct factual position regarding compensation of LBT/allotment of share of revenue to Pune Cantonment Board derived by the State Government/Central Government from collection of GST within the limits of Pune Cantonment. However, the President, Cantonment Board pointed out that Members should visit New Delhi and personally look into the matter and to convince the concerned MPs regarding the issue. Matter discussed. Board resolved that the Vice President and Elected Members will take a suitable date and time for the special meeting and further which will be convened through the Board.

Further Shri. Atul Gaikwad – Elected Member pointed out that since parliament session is going on, a letter should be forwarded to the MPs / MLAs of Pune to raise the issue of allotment of share of GST to Pune Cantonment during the ongoing parliament session. Board noted the same.

After detailed discussions and deliberations resolved as under :-

- i. The Board will forward letters to PD DE & DG DE seeking opinion / advice to file the Writ in the appropriate court, which will be awaited till 1st February, 2019 and if no advice will be received from the PD DE / DG DE, it will be assumed that PDDE / DG DE has nothing to give advice and thereafter the Board will file Writ in the appropriate Court.
- ii. The Board will convene a special meeting with MP / MLAs alongwith the Guardian Minister, after receiving the appropriate date and time from the Vice President & Elected Members of the Board. Simultaneously the Board requested that the subject matter be intimated to Higher Authorities through Army Channel
- **02.** To confirm the minutes of the Health & Hygiene Committee held on 29.10.2018. (copy enclosed).

RESOLUTION NO. 2: Considered. Resolved to confirm the minutes of the Health & Hygiene Committee except Item No. 1.

Item No. 1: Shri. Ashok Pawar alongwith all Elected Members stated that the hospital charges should not be enhanced. CEO explained that the services in the Hospital has been exorbitantly added considering the benefit of the residents residing within the Cantonment.CEO further stated the current population of the Cantonment is approx. 54000 and in comparison to the services / facilities being provided as on date in the Hospital should be only 1/4th. Hence considering this factual position, the enhanced rates should be approved. Further President Cantonment Board enquired about the total expenditure being incurred & total income of the Hospital annually. RMO informed that approx. Rs.12.00 cr. is the annual expenditure and Rs.1.50 cr. is annual income. Further Vice President enquired about the additional income to be yielded by the Board, if the enhanced rates are approved. RMO explained that approx. Rs. 20.00 lakhs per annum would be President suggested that considering expenditure in comparison to the income, the enhanced rates are nominal and should be approved in order to generate additional income to the Board.

RESOLUTION NO. 10: Considered and approved. Further CEO informed the Board that during the cultural only two awards has been secured by the Board. Further he stated that the performance of the children of the Board was not upto the mark and to this effect letters has been issued to all the HMs of the School for grooming the child for overall performance. The Board noted the same.

11. EXTENSION IN TIME LIMIT : B. NO. 6 PARVATI VILLA ROAD : PUNE CANTT.

To consider letter dated 15.10.2018 received from the Director, Himmat Land Hoardings Pvt. Ltd., HOR of the subject property bearing B. No. 6 Parvati Villa Road requesting to grant extension in time limit for a period of one year for completion of the remaining work of the main bungalow.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note :The building plans for demolition & reconstruction of main bungalow for residential purpose was sanctioned by the Board vide CBR NO. 26 dated 23.08.2016 and the sanction was communicated by this office on 01.09.2016. Therefore the said sanction is valid for a period of two years i.e. upto 30.08.2018. Further the HOR vide his letter dated 25.07.2017 has informed that the construction work of the main bungalow was started on 20.10.2017 and hence the sanction is valid for a period of one year from the date of commencement i.e. upto 19.10.2018.

As per Section 245 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 not more than two such extension, each for not more than one year can be allowed in each case.

RESOLUTION NO. 11: Considered. Resolved to grant extension in time limit to the HOR of property bearing B. No.6 Parvati Villa Road for a period of one year for completion of the remaining work of the main bungalow w.e.f. 20.10.2018 as per Section 245 of the Cantonments Act, 2006. CEE to initiate further action.

12. ISSUE OF NOTICE UNDER SECTION 248 OF THE CANTONMENTS ACT 2006: HOUSE NO. 114 GHORPURI VILLAGE: PUNE CANTT.

To consider issue of notice under Section 248 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 to Shri. Somnath Mohan Pardeshi & 6 Others, Owner / occupier of subject property has carried out following unauthorized construction for which show cause notice was issued on 03.09.2018 and also notice under Section 239(1) of C.A. 2006 dated 03.09.2018 & 239 (2) of the Cantonments Act 2006 dated 06.09.2018 was issued.

"Partly construction of ground floor measuring 27'9" x 17'4" x 9'5" ht. approx. and First & Second Floor measuring 31'4" x 18'9" x 9'5" ht. approx. in RCC framed structure at the subject property."

Further work is in progress.

The subject site is situated outside notified Civil Area of Pune Cantonment and land under the management of Collector, Pune.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

RESOLUTION NO. 12: Considered. Resolved to issue notice under Section 248 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 giving 30 days of time,

failing which further notice under Section 320 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 be issued by giving 10 days time.

13. APPOINTMENT OF CONSULTANT FOR TERTIARY TREATMENT PLANT AT 900 BOOTTEE STREET

To consider the issue for appointment of Consultant for Tertiary Treatment Plant at 900 Boottee Street in order to treat the treated water being disposed from the Sewage Treatment Plant, so that the same can be utilized for gardening, washing etc.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

RESOLUTION NO. 13: Considered. AEE (Civil) explained that there is a necessity for further treatment of approx. 10 – 15 mld treated water being disposed from the existing Sewage Treatment Plant at 900 Boottee Street, which will be utilized for any purpose other than drinking purpose. Matter discussed. Members also opined that this is a good initiative and must be carried out. Further President enquired about the approx. expenditure towards the same. AEE (Civil) explained that for consultancy purpose an approx. expenditure of Rs. 2 – 3 lakhs would be incurred. Matter discussed. Resolved to invite public notice for engagement of a Consultant for Tertiary Treatment at 900 Boottee Street in order to treat the treated water being disposed from the Sewage Treatment Plant. CEE to initiate further necessary action.

14. DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION, SUPPLY, INSTALLATION, TESTING AND COMMISSIONING OF 20 MLD CAPACITY RAW SEWAGE PUMPING STATION AND SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT INCLUDING OPERATION & MAINTENANCE OF FIVE YEARS AT PUNE CANTONMENT

To consider the issue of sanction for amount of Rs. 5,34,40,000/- for 20 mld capacity sewage Treatment Plant at 900 Boottee Street, Pune Cantt. under D-1(a) Head.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note: The estimated cost of the project of 20 mld Sewage Treatment Plant alongwith Operation & Maintenance for five years was 32.0 crores. Tender were called on the said estimated cost of Rs. 32.0 crores. The lowest tenderer M/s.Khillari Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd quoted 16.70% above the estimated cost. Thus the total cost of the project comes to Rs. 37,34,40,000/-. Accordingly, proposal was sent to Govt. of India, Ministry of Defence for grants sanction under for Creation of Capital Assets.

The Govt. of India, Min. of Defence vide letter dated 20.03.2015 accorded sanction of Rs. 32.0 Crores and released a sum of Rs.

24,62,22,472/- through various Govt. sanction letters. It was understood that the Board will receive the entire amount of Rs. 32.0 Cr. till the end of completion of construction of project so that the total cost of construction of the project of Rs. 2873.0 lakhs could be cleared and also cost of operation and maintenance of 22 months i.e 315.70 lakh will be me out from the said sanctioned amount of Rs. 32.0 Cr.

In view of above, the Board have not made any separate provision under any other head in the Budget since 2015-16 upto 2018-19. At no time, the Board was intimated by the Dte., DE / Dte. Gen. DE that the Board has to expend balance amount of Rs. 5,34,40,000/- from its own funds and that the maintenance cost of Rs. 7,37,77,528/- will be released annually for five years otherwise necessary budget provision could have been made in the Annual Budget to obtain the GOC-in-C, SC, Pune. of After making correspondence with Dte. DE / DGDE from year 2015, the DGDE at very later stage vide letter dated 31.10.2018 intimated that since Cantonment Board, Pune has already been allotted a sum of Rs. 24,62,22,472/- through various Government sanction letters. There is no amount due with Dte. General against this project, except the maintenance cost of Rs. 7,37,77,528/- to be released annually for five years and first installment on account of yearly operation & maintenance cost will be released in current financial year.

The construction of the project has been completed in April, 2018 and since then Operation & Maintenance is being carried out by the contractor M/s. Khilari Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd.

RESOLUTION NO. 14: Considered. AEE (Civil) informed the Board that several communications has been carried out with DGDE, New Delhi for releasing the balance of Rs. 5,34,40,000/- out of the sanctioned fund under Capital Asset Head of Rs. 32.00 crores for 20 mld capacity sewage Treatment Plant at 900 Boottee Street. He further brought to the notice of the Board that the DGDE vide letter dated 31.10.2018 has informed the Board that no amount is due with Dte. General against this project, except the maintenance cost of Rs. 7,37,77,528/- to be released annually for five years and first installment on account of yearly operation & maintenance cost will be released in current financial year. The Board noted the same. CEO suggested that since the subject work has already commissioned, there are chances that the concerned contractor may go for arbitration for releasing the balance payment. Further CEO also informed the Board that considering the present financial situation, the payment cannot be made from the available funds. The Elected Members informed that if the Board does not release the balance payment, the Board may have to face legal complications. Further the President opined that considering the mandatory monthly expenditure of the Board and the available funds with the Board, this expenditure cannot be incurred through the available funds. The Board noted the discussions. After detailed discussions and deliberations, resolved that the Board will bear the cost of O&M for all time on receipt of funds from DGDE and hence the DGDE be requested to release the balance amount of Rs. 5,34,40,000/- out of the total sanction amount of Rs. 32.00 Cr towards the subject work.

15. EXTENSION IN TIME LIMIT FOR LAYING OPTICAL FIBRE CABLE BY THE SOUTHERN COMMAND SIGNAL REGIMENT: PUNE CANTT.

Reference CBR No. 25 dated 19.09.2017.

To consider letter bearing No. PC 3059/PROJ/NFS/ROW dated 22.11.2018 received from the Officer Commanding, Southern Command Signal Regiment requesting to grant extension in time limit upto 30th May, 2019 for completion of remaining work for laying of Optical Fibre Cable on various roads under the project of NFS.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note: The Board vide above referred resolution resolved to grant permission to lay Optical Fibre Cable on various roads as per details shown on the agenda. The road cutting charges amounting to Rs. 2,36,83,000/- was paid by the L&T Construction. The permission was granted vide this office letter dated 11.12.2017 and the same was valid upto 30.05.2018.

RESOLUTION NO. 15: Considered. Resolved to grant extension in time limit upto 30th May, 2019 for completion of remaining work for laying of Optical Fibre Cable on various roads under the project of NFS to the Southern Command Signal Regiment. CEE to initiate further necessary action.

16. ISSUE OF NOTICE UNDER SECTION 248 OF THE CANTONMENTS ACT 2006: HOUSE NO. 110-A GHORPURI VILLAGE: PUNE CANTT.

To consider issue of notice under Section 248 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 to Shri. Vitthal Pallani Swamy & Mrs. Sumathi Vitthal Swamy, Owner / occupier of subject property has carried out following deviation / unauthorized construction violating the sanctioned building plan sanctioned by this office vide letter No. 7-1/9646 of 2018 dated 16.02.2018 for which show cause notice was issued on 08.10.2018 and also notice under Section 239(1) of C.A. 2006 dated 08.10.2018 & 239 (2) of the Cantonments Act 2006 dated 11.10.2018 was issued.

"Construction of Second floor measuring 13' + 11'9" / 2 x 26' + 29'5" /2 x 9' ht. approx. plus 5' x 14' x 9' ht. approx. in RCC column & BB masonary wall at the subject property."

Further work is in progress.

The subject site is situated outside notified Civil Area of Pune Cantonment and land under the management of Collector, Pune.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

RESOLUTION NO. 16: Considered. Resolved to issue notice under Section 248 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 giving 30 days of time, failing which further notice under Section 320 of the Cantonments Act, 2006 be issued by giving 10 days time.

17. EXTENSION TO THE EXISTING CONTRACT FOR HIRING OF 12 NOS. OF HYDRAULIC HOOPER & 3 NOS. TIPPER VEHICLES TO BE USED AS GHANTAGADI FOR DOOR TO DOOR COLLECTION OF GARBAGE

To note the extension in time period granted to the existing contract for the period upto 30th November, 2018 for hiring of 12 Nos. of Hydraulic Hooper & 3 Nos. of Hydraulic Hooper & 3 Nos. Tipper Vehicles to be used as Ghantagadi for door to door collection of garbage.

Connected papers alongwith office report are placed on the table.

Note: The subject contract was concluded on 31st October, 2018. Meanwhile the Board vide CBR No. 9 dated 22.10.2018 has approved the lowest rate of Global India Travels for providing 5 Nos. of Tippers with Driver & diesel. The tender is being finalized.

RESOLUTION NO. 17: Considered and noted. The Vice President & Elected Members informed that the residents residing in the congested / scattered areas of Cantonment limits are facing problems due to non-collection of wet & dry garbage on day to day basis since the Tippers does not have easy access to the congested areas / byelanes for garbage collection. Hence it is requested that Ghanta Gadi may be hired to resolve this issue. Meanwhile, CHS informed the Board that already two Ghanta Gadi has been hired instead of one Tipper for resolving this issue. The Elected Members suggested that additional Ghanta Gadi may be hired for resolving the issue. President opined that considering the health & hygiene of the residents, the Health & Hygiene Committee to assess the requirement of Ghanta Gadi, Tippers & Safaikarmacharies in each wards, so that this issue can be resolved. Matter discussed. Resolved to ask the existing contractor i.e. Global India Travels to provide 3 Nos. of Tippers and Four Ghanta Gadis and meanwhile the Health & Hygiene Committee will assess the requirement. CHS to initiate necessary action to hire required number of Ghanta Gadis as an interim measure to keep the area clean without any compromise. CEO is authorized to incur the necessary expenditure towards the same.

18. PAYMENT OF DIFFERENTIAL AMOUNT ON ACCOUNT OF INCREASE IN MINIMUM WAGES TO M/s. VIKRAMADITYA SECURITY SERVICES FOR PROVIDING 51 SECURITY GUARDS WITHIN THE CANTONMENT LIMITS.

Reference CBR No.53 dtd.20.08.2018.

To consider letter dated 15.10.2018 from M/s. Vikramaditya Security services regarding payment of differential amount arrears of Rs. 51,59,868.57 i.e (Rs. 5,73,318.73 x 9 months = 51,59,868.57) w.e.f. January, 2018 to September, 2018 & further the revised pay be made applicable for providing 51 security guards within the Cantonment limits.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note: M/s. Vikramaditya Security services vide above letter dated 15.10.2018 has requested to pay the differential amount in respect of the contract for provision of security guards on account of revision in minimum wages.

In this connection, the Govt. of India, Ministry of Labour & Employment, Office of the Chief Labour Commissioner, New Delhi, dt. 20.04.2017 & accordingly the wage calculation sheet per month as per wage structure of area "A", presently Board is paying Rs. 5,76,898.74 per month as per wage structure of area "B" which is to be revised as per structure of area "A".

As per CBR No. 53 dtd. 20.08.2018 the Board considered & resolved to pay differential amount of Rs.20,28,780.00 for the month of August, 2017 to December 2017 to the said firm.

The said amount has been verified and observed that the differential amount of Rs.51,59,868.57 is payable to them.

Since P.C.B is the Principal Employer as per Minimum Wages Act, therefore the amount to be paid to the concerned labours/employees engaged through labour contractor PCB has to make the payment as per revised/increased Minimum Wages Act to the existing contractor.

However it is suggested that at the time of making a disbursement, the contractor needs to submit proofs of payment made to the respective employees and also deposit the ESI, EPF to the respective Govt. department.

Till the time the contractor submits the proof of payment to the respective employees/labours bank account, he may be asked to submit equivalent bank guarantee.

RESOLUTION NO. 18: Considered. CHS informed the Board that the arrears of M/s. Vikramaditya Security services w.e.f. August, 2017 to December, 2017 amounting to Rs. 20,28,780.00, which has been approved by the Board has not been released yet due to non-receipt of

proof of payment of arrears to the respective persons so engaged by the firm or to submit Bank Guarantee of such amount to be paid. The Board was of the opinion that since the contractor has not submitted the proof towards the earlier arrears to be paid, the matter regarding payment of differential amount arrears of Rs. 51,59,868.57 i.e (Rs. 5,73,318.73 x 9 months = 51,59,868.57) w.e.f. January, 2018 to September, 2018 be brought before the Board after releasing the earlier arrears amounting to Rs. 20,28,780.00 subject to submission of necessary proofs in all aspects. The Board noted and approved the same. Further the Board resolved to revise the pay as applicable w.e.f. 1st October, 2018. CHS to initiate further action.

19. RE-EXAMINING THE E-TENDER FOR ENGAGING 51 SECURITY PERSONNEL (WITHOUT ARMS) FROM NON-DGR SPONSORED AGENCIES FOR VARIOUS SITES WITHIN THE LIMITS OF PUNE CANTONMENT BOARD

Reference CBR No. 3 (7 FC dated 14.08.2018) dated 20.08.2018.

To consider the report dated 09.10.2018 submitted by the Chartered Accountant and to further decide on the tenders for engagement of 51 security personnel (without arms) from NON-DGR sponsored agencies for various sites within the limits of Pune Cantonment. The rates quoted are as under –

Note: The Board vide above referred resolution had resolved to refer the matter to the Chartered Accountant to re-examine the tenders received. Accordingly the tenders were forwarded to the Chartered Accountant. The Chartered Accountant has submitted his detailed report dtd. 09.10.2018 as under -

a) Reply for objections received from S Khalsa Enterprises:

The three firms participated in the tender do not qualify in the financial bid:

- i. AP Group: has quoted old basic +VDA
 Reply: The Chartered Accountant has already disqualified AP Group in the financial bid.
- ii. Vishal Intelligence Security Services: Quoted Old Bonus Rates.

Reply: The Chartered Accountant has already disqualified Vishal Intelligence Security Services in the financial bid.

iii. Eagle Hunter Solution Ltd.: Has quoted in sr.no.15 of financial bid column mentioned 0.5%, which is not valid and

also not legal, has manipulated the financial bid by mentioning the 0.5 (service charges per month) also in sr.no.16 has not taken the service charge of 0.5 on the total amount.

Reply: writing **@ 0.5** does not affect the validity in the financial bid, as the figures quoted are in the financial bid are not invalid, therefore in his opinion mere mentioning 0.5% does not affect the legality or cannot be termed as manipulation. As what is important is the figures quoted in the financial bid and since the figures quoted are not manipulated therefore on this ground he cannot disqualify the tender participant. Further at sr. no. 16 the service charges not quoted, as the column for service charges is at sr.no.15 and the total thereof has been taken at sr.no.17.

b) Reply for objections received from NTS Group:

- i. In BOQ provided by PCB cannot be amended/added any words, as the agency added some words.
 - **Reply:** Just writing @0.5% does not vitiate the BOQ/financial bid, so long as the material facts are reported properly in the financial bid by the tender participant, therefore the Chartered Accountant do not find valid reason for rejection for the financial bid on this ground.
- ii. It is seen in column no.16, the agency has claimed Rs.300 per head for 51 persons i.e 15300 for further increasing VDA, in future, but agency not claim their service charges in this VDA amount. So this amount treated as 0% service charges. **Reply:** The agency has quoted the service charges Rs.6571.1 per month, therefore objection is not acceptable.

c) Reply for objections received from Classic Guard Services Pvt. Ltd.

The objections raised by Classic Guard services pvt. Ltd., are exactly same as worded by Khalsa Enterprises in sr. no. (a) above, these objection are just duplicate of objections raised by Khasla enterprises.

Reply: to this objection is given at sr. no. (a) above.

As per the report of the Chartered Accountant, it seems that Eagle Hunter Solution Ltd. is qualified & is **L-1** in the financial bid.

RESOLUTION NO. 19: Considered. CHS informed the Board that the validity period of the tender was for 90 days, which has been expired. Hence the tender is required to be rejected and may be invited fresh. The Board noted the same. President opined that the requirement of 51 Security guards may be re-assessed considering the financial position of the Board. The Board noted and approved the same. Matter discussed. Resolved to reject the subject tenders and to invite fresh

tenders after re-assessing the actual requirement of security personnel (without arms) from NON-DGR sponsored agencies for various sites within the limits of Pune Cantonment within a period of one month. The Board further resolved that till the finalization of the tender the existing contractor may be continued. CHS to initiate necessary action.

20. MAINTAINANCE OF TOILET BLOCK AT J.J.GARDEN ON PAY & USE BASIS.

Reference CBR No.46 dated 18.12.2013.

To consider letter bearing No.NBF/32/2018-19 dated 06.09.2018 received from Nalini Rajan Singh, Secretary, M/s. Nirmal Bharat Foundation requesting to extend the time period for further five (5) years for maintenance of toilet block at J. J. Garden and also requested to allot electric connection/meter on his name & he would pay electricity bill accordingly.

At present the electric connection/meter has been provided by Pune Cantonment Board.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note: The Board vide CBR No.46 dated 18.12.2013 resolved and approved the offer submitted by M/s. Nirmal Bharat Foundation for operation and maintenance of toilet block at J. J. Garden on pay and use basis for a period of five years @ Rs. 1,000/- per month. However the period of five years w.e.f. 11.01.2014 is expiring on 10.01.2019.

The case is recommended for extension for further five years as their work performance is good & no complaints has been received from public till date.

RESOLUTION NO. 20: Considered. Smt. Priyanka R Shrigiri, Vice President suggested that additional two toilet blocks viz. Toilet block near Mangal Vihar and Toilet block inside the campus of 35 MG Road – Court premises should also be handed over to M/s. Nirmal Bharat Foundation for operation and maintenance on pay and use basis for further period of five years in order to maintain hygienic condition. Matter discussed. Resolved to grant permission for operation and maintenance of toilet blocks at J. J. Garden, Toilet block near Mangal Vihar and Toilet block inside the campus of 35 MG Road – Court premises on pay and use basis for a period of five years @ Rs. 2,500/-per month each toilet block.

Further the Board rejected the request of Nalini Rajan Singh, Secretary, M/s. Nirmal Bharat Foundation for allotment of Electricity meter on his name.

CHS to initiate necessary action.

It is stated in the said notice that all concerned persons that all illegal hoardings which are erected & installed on defence land of all categories (i.e A-1, A-2, B-4, B-3, C) including the terms of Old Grant/Lease/Freehold must be removed by 30-11-2018. Therefore all illegal advertisements hoardings have to be removed by the concerned persons on or before 30-11-2018 failing which such advertisement hoardings shall be removed by the Cantonment Board at the risk and cost of all concerned persons.

But till date not a single hoarding has been removed by the concerned person. Thereafter this office has issued notice dated 30-11-2018 stating to remove the advertisement hoarding structure within **SEVEN** days from receipt of letter. It is further stated that if they fail to remove the hoarding necessary action under provisions of Cantonment Act 2006, will be initiated including removal of hoarding departmentally and the charges for removal will be recovered from them.

Meanwhile letter dated 28-11-2018 has been received from Mr. Milind Ahire stating that "in spite of repeated demands, the Pune Cantonment Board has not framed the hoarding policy. Various local authorities have framed hoarding policy, in accordance with guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Mumbai High Court in the matter of Suswarajya, Foundation V/s Collector Satara. He further stated that he has filed a Civil Suit bearing No. 5773/2012 before the Hon'ble Civil Court, thereby challenging the resolution passed by the Pune Cantonment Board wherein the Hon'ble Civil Court was pleased to grant the order of status quo. Further the Said civil suit is pending and there is no resolution passed by the Cantonment Board in its general body authorizing Pune Cantonment Board to publish such public notice".

Also letter dated 29-11-2018 received from Captions Outdoor Advertising, Target Advertising, Cartel Advertising, Sahu Advertising states that these hoardings erected by them are sanctioned since last 18 years and since then they are renewing licences every year & paying the fees regularly. Few years back Pune Cantonment Board

has started collecting damage charges and now Pune Cantonment Board has issued notice for removal of hoarding. Thereafter they requested to allow them to renew the licence to enable them to regularize the things.

The Board vide CBR No.23 dated 02-12-2016 resolved to revise the rate of existing damage charges to Rs.220/- per sq.ft per year to be levied on display of hoardings on private land within Cantonment limits. Accordingly this office has issued notice dated 30-04-2017 for payment of damage charges for unauthorized display of advertisement on hoardings within limits of Pune Cantonment for the period 01-03-2016 to 31-03-2017.

RESOLUTION NO. 37: Considered. The Board was of the opinion that instead of removing the hoardings, the applicants be asked to submit structural stability certificate / report in order to evaluate the safety and stability of the hoarding structure, since the Board is yielding revenue. Further the Board was of the opinion that the structural stability report should be submitted through authorized Government Consultant to be engaged by the Board. Matter discussed. Resolved to invite quotations for engagement of Structural Engineer / firm in order to assess the stability of the hoarding displayed on the private buildings. Further after engagement of the firm / Engineer, the report of the concerned firms should be submitted within one month and on the basis of the report submitted to initiate further action for removal of hoardings / acceptance of applicable. Further the Board charges as simultaneously quotations be called for engagement of expert agency for removal of hoardings. The matter be approved through Circular Agenda. CEE / CRS to initiate further necessary action.

38. LEASING OUT THE PREMISES OF GROUND FLOOR OF THE STORE BUILDING LOCATED AT DHOBI GHAT: PUNE CANTT

To consider the question of leasing out the premises of ground floor of the Store Building located at Dhobi Ghat to the Government / Semi Government / Government Aided Organization in order to generate additional revenue to the Board.

Connected papers are placed on the table.

Note: The Store Building consists of ground plus two floors. The ground floor is occupied by the Central Stores and the first & second floor is occupied by PWD as well as Electrical Department. The Central Store can be shifted on the first floor and the PWD & Electrical Department can be accommodated on the second floor.

RESOLUTION NO. 38: Considered. Resolved to publish a Notice in the local newspapers inviting expression of interest from Government / Semi Government / Government Aided Organization for leasing out the premises of ground floor of the Store Building located at Dhobi

Ghat for a period of five years in order to exploring the idea of generating additional revenue to the Board. CRS to initiate necessary action.
